CONSERVATION COMMISSION

MEETING MINUTES

November 17, 2020

Call to Order: Carol Vita-Chair called the meeting to order at 10:25 AM.

Roll Call: Carol Vita, John Mullen Present. Quorum was present. No Public persons attending.

Opening Remarks: None

Review of Past Minutes: Motion made by John Mullen to approve minutes of October 13, 2020 as transcribed. Carol Vita-seconded.

Vote: 2 yeas, 0 nays: motion carried.

New Business: The Commission will send formal invitation to Cheryl Kimball and Kate Buzard to become Alternate members. The invitation will offer remote participation for those not being able to attend meetings live.

Old Business:

1. Revitalization Plan: Discussion about the Revitalization plan was discussed. As of this meeting no indication from BOS on questions of Tanglewood and CC needed equipment. The Commission will request to be on the BOS meeting agenda for December 12, 2020 to further discuss our needs.
2. Questions for CC Survey: Continued development of using a survey when we have a communication channel open was made. Several survey questions were brought forth and will be continued to be developed.
3. Tanglewood Status: The Clerk shared a list of from the Assessor Clerk listing all properties that were listed with Conservation Commission as "second owner". The list was only a partial representation of all properties in Tanglewood. Therefore, the clerk requested the Assessing clerk to provide a similar list of all properties with a "Tanglewood" address and be returned by December 22, 2020. Reason for acquiring this data is to determine what properties are those under control of the Town, the Town/Conservation Commission and the Conservation Commission. This will enable to better plan for development of the property.
4. Milfoil Grant Application: John Mullen, Invasive Species Coordinator, explained the Milfoil status in Sunrise lake, this past fall's mitigation and the current grant

process underway for next years mitigation. It was advised that very little, 20 gallons, of milfoil was removed this past summer. Therefore, it appears that the state will utilize individual divers and no DASH or herbicide.

Adjournment: Motion made by John Mullen to adjourn. Carol Vita seconded.
