Opening Remarks: C. Vita welcomed guest those from Fish and Game, and various OTH club members.

Review of Past Minutes: K. Buzard made a motion to accept the minutes of June 15, 2021 as transcribed. J. Mullen seconded the motion.

Vote: C. Vita yea, J. Mullen yea. K. Buzard yea. 3 yeas 0 nays 0 abstention. Motion carried.

Correspondences

- An email was shared from Nora E. Hanke of NHDES requesting information of Middleton's Aquifer Conservation Overlay District. K. Buzard indicated she might have such a document electronically and will check. Middleton does not have such a file.

Old Business

- **Blueberry Hill Property: Blueberry Hill Property:** Discussion continued how to proceed on what do with the property. At the request of CC requested that J. Keegan arrange to have the local ATV Club meet with the Commission next meeting to explain what clubs do in terms of trails etc. At the suggestion of J. Keegan, he expressed that we need to move forward and it was decided that the Commission will formulate a recommendation to the BOS that at this time the property should be held by the Town for the time being until further study by the Commission can be conducted and a more definitive recommendation be made. The clerk will write a recommendation at report it to the CC at its next regular meeting. Some of the future recommendations would make it a Town Forest, a Conservation area. Further discussion and investigation will continue. K. Buzard will investigate such options.
- **Tanglewood:** Discussions continued how to proceed with the development of the property. J. Mullen indicated that we still have much to do. K. Buzard inquired about the status of the proposed grant the C. Kimball started. J. Mullen would check on the particulars. Discussion continued about the lots plans and traffic issued raised. J. Mullen made a motion to send a recommendation that the Board of Selectmen refrain from doing anything with a property for at least 12months so continued investigation can continue. K. Buzard seconded.

*Vote: C. Vita yea, J. Mullen yea. K. Buzard yea. 3 yeas 0 nays 0 abstention.
Motion carried.*

J. Mullen will draft a memo from the chair to the BOS as to our recommendation.

- **Blueberry Hill (Jessie Mountain):** J. Keegan introduced various guest from F&G and various OTV clubs to offer points of view of trail establishment on Jessie Mountain. The discussion was over an hour and contained much information and comments. (Articles of Agreement for Granite State ATV Association, Trail Administrative Duties, 2019 AHRV GIA Awards, other various documents on a thumb drive, yet transcribed provided by Adam Buehne-President of NDVATVC.

K. St. Pierre indicated that trail develop take much work between all stakeholders within a community. He suggested that you go slow in the process. Start with one train and they see how it goes. Most of F&G issues for OHV is riding on public roads and provide land. Most OHV riders are law abiding and follow rules. Consideration should be given to all forms of OHV (Multiple Use) but that is up to the owners of the property. You can limit types and time of use. Additionally, a Fire and Police Department should be involved in planning and training as to where trails are and how to access them in emergencies.

Joe Varga expressed some concerns on trails have on local fire and police departments. K. St. Pierre indicated that once initial training is complete, and a process is established little involvement will occur. Most trail users on law abiding participants and many are family outings.

M. Gelinas expressed the importance of providing parking spaces after a concern was expressed by J. Mullen of town road congestion and parking issues within a neighborhood.

Adam Buehne advised multiple use have designated trails for various OHV's. Providing a parking lot would ease concerns about road parking. Also indicated that have a Trail Administrator would help in managing the trails within a property.

J. Keegan indicated that he wants a trail club in Middleton and have a Trail Administrator would be helpful,

Cory Mattocks explained the role of a trail administrator. An administrator would be the main contact between OHV clubs and the NH Bureau of Trails.

- **Proposed By-Laws:** J. Mullen made a motion to approve the final draft. C. Vita Seconded. J. Mullen presented the final draft of the By-Laws. Mention of Intent to Cut procedures were removed from previous had been removed and a section on public comment was added. K. Buzard and C. Vita expressed concerns about limiting public input at a meeting. J. Mullen reminded members that the meeting is do the CC work and while public input is helpful it should not take time from the Commission's tasks. J. Mullen indicated that the final draft proposal does allow the Chair to extend public comment with the approval of the Commission members. Before, a vote was taken J. Mullen another proposal that was fashioned off the City of Salem's Conservation Commission By-Laws. J. Mullen offered this and indicated that this version was a little more detailed with many references to NH RSA's. K. Buzard requested that we postpone the vote so more time can be given to review the new proposal. J. Mullen rescinded his motion. *(It should be noted that you can't rescind a motion that has already been seconded. You must vote up or down. This will be corrected at next meeting.)* The review of By-Laws will continue at the next regular meeting.
- **Change Meeting date:** C. Vita made a motion to change the regular meeting date from the third Tuesday of each month to the second Tuesday of each month. K. Buzard seconded the motion.

- *Vote: C. Vita yea, J. Mullen yea. K. Buzard yea. 3 yeas 0 nays 0 abstention. Motion carried.*

J. Mullen will change the date on the webpage and properly post the new meeting schedule.

- J. Mullen continued discussion about Conservation Fund held at Profile Bank. Per previous discussion within the Commission further clarification needed to fully understand the conditions of the fund. J. Mullen visited the Profile Bank and had a discussion with Laura Colbath of Profile Bank. Questions were asked about the withdrawal policy, and it was clarified those withdrawals can be made and they are at the discretion of the bank. They would allow them but not monthly or in small amounts. A memo of the conservation was presented to commission and will be filed.

Motion to adjourn by J. Mullen, seconded by K. Buzard.

ARTICLES OF AGREEMENT
OF
A NEW HAMPSHIRE NONPROFIT CORPORATION

THE UNDERSIGNED, BEING PERSONS OF LAWFUL AGE, ASSOCIATE UNDER THE PROVISIONS OF THE NEW HAMPSHIRE REVISED STATUTES ANNOTATED, CHAPTER 292 BY THE FOLLOWING:

Article 1. The name of the corporation shall be:

GRANITE STATE ATV ASSOCIATION

Article 2. The object for which this corporation is established is:

Create an ongoing communications forum through which off-highway recreational vehicle (OHRV) enthusiasts and their organizations and supporters can share information and experience, participate in educational opportunities, and become partners in creating a positive image of the sport.

Article 3. The provisions for establishing membership and participation in the corporation are:

The membership shall consist of operators and users of ATV's, trail motorcycles, OHV's and other enthusiasts or persons actively concerned with promoting the positive future of off highway recreational opportunities. Honorary members shall be any other persons as the GSATVA members may decide by 2/3 vote of the Executive Committee of those present at any regular meeting. Membership in this organization shall be determined on a nondiscriminatory basis, without regard for age, sex, race, color, religion, or national origin. All members shall have an equal stake in the association and its activities. Membership shall be ongoing, subject to termination for good cause, as determined by the Executive Committee and the established policies of the association.

Article 4. The provisions for disposition of the corporate assets in the event of dissolution of the corporation including the prioritization of rights of shareholders and members to corporate assets are:

This organization may be disbanded and dissolved by 2/3 majority vote of the general membership upon determination that the organization is no longer viable or effective in achieving its vision, mission, or purpose. Upon dissolution and after satisfying all legal and financial obligations and liabilities, the Executive Committee shall donate all remaining assets of this organization to an organization of similar mission and purpose.

Trail Administrator Duties

A club's Trail Administrator (TA) is the main contact between the club and the NH Bureau of Trails in regards to the Grant-In-Aid (GIA) Program.

Duties include:

- Attending regular club meetings;
- Familiarizing themselves with the GIA Rules (Res 8400) (http://www.gencourt.state.nh.us/rules/state_agencies/res8100-8500.html)
- Familiarizing themselves with the GIA Guidelines (<https://www.nhstateparks.org/about-us/trails-bureau/grants/grant-in-aid>)
- Familiarizing themselves with the Program Information and Forms on the BOT's GIA Web Page (<https://www.nhstateparks.org/about-us/trails-bureau/grants/grant-in-aid>);
- Communicating via email and telephone with the GIA Program Specialist;
- Completing and submitting GIA applications (on snowmobile grants this includes attending NHSA County Advisor meeting for their signatures);
- Providing required information, such as a current Certificate of Good Standing, updated trail map, officer listing, and landowner list, to the GIA Program Specialist;
- Signing GIA Agreements between the club and the BOT;
- Managing GIA approved project expenses and requesting reimbursement from the GIA Program Specialist; and,
- Working with the BOT on trail related issues.
